


MARRIAGE BETWEEN MARCEL GAMACHE AND MARIE CASSE



TRANSLATION

February 8 1864, after the publication of 3 banns of marriage made in the preach of our parish masses between Marcel Gamache, carpenter, adult son of Joseph Gamache, and of late Rose Dubé, from this parish on the one hand, and Marie Casse, minor daughter of François Casse and Clémentine Gagnon from this parish, on the other hand. Not having discovered any impediment to marriage, we, the undersigned parish priest of Saint-Roch of Quebec, received their mutual consent to marriage, with the approval of the father of the wife, and gave them the nuptial blessing in the presence of Joseph Gamache, father of the husband, and of Hyacinthe Beaulieu who did not know how to sign, nor the couple.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- Dates : The date is always the first information given
- Banns : Usually the second information you can gather *can also be placed after the names of the bride and groom

And then you will find in this order:

- Name of the Groom
- Parents of the groom
- Parish of the groom
- Name of the bride
- Parents of the bride
- Parish of the bride

Be careful, in the case that this is a second marriage for the man or the woman, instead of the parents, you will find the name of the previous spouse.

You will need to find the widow's or widower's first marriage certificate.

This information is usually in all the marriage certificate, from New-France to 1940. Some of them can be absent, like the names of the parents in the early certificate.

Also, some information, like employment can be found, usually after the name of the groom.

Take a look to the witnesses, they can provide rich information on family surroundings. You will find them at the end of the document
